1. This Llama and youth show is approved by ALSA as a Level III Eastern Regional Qualifier. All rules and guidelines will be in accordance with the current 14^{th} edition ALSA Handbook with amendments. All Llamas entered must be registered with the ILR or CLRC with the exception of non-breeders.

2. Copies of the registration papers must accompany show entry forms.

Entries must be postmarked or emailed on or before May 10, 2008.
 Entries postmarked after May 10, 2008 will be a charged a \$50 late entry fee.

5. All Llamas entered in ALSA classes must be born on or before January 7, 2008.

6. All crias under 5 months must be accompanied by their dam.

7. The New York Grand HOBO Show accepts no responsibility regarding sales of animals. No Llama under five months may be offered for sale on the show grounds.

8. Llamas not entered in the show are not permitted on the show grounds with the exception of nursing cria accompanying their dam. Exceptions may be made with prior consent by show management.

Show Vet

There will be a veterinarian on call throughout the weekend for the show. Vet charges must be negotiated between the vet and the exhibitor.

Health Regulations

- All Llamas must show no evidence of infectious or contagious disease.
- ♦ Health certificate issued within <u>30</u> days of entry.
- Individual identification. Acceptable forms of identification include ear tag, microchip, tattoo or registration number – copy of registration must be attached to Health Certificate.
- Brucellosis. Llamas and alpacas 180 days or more of age shall be negative to an official blood test for brucellosis conducted within 30 days prior to entry.
- Tuberculosis. Llamas and alpacas 365 days or more of age shall be negative to an official test for tuberculosis by the Axillary Method conducted within 60 days prior to entry. Indicate axillary method on the health certificate.
- Intrastate: Please bring a health certificate within 30 days

ALSA Numbers

ALSA members must include their ALSA numbers on the entry form. For ALSA points, all Llamas, children and showmen that are recorded with ALSA must have their ALSA number included on the entry form.

Bedding

Bedding is required. Mats, carpeting, shavings, kenaf pellets, and straw are acceptable. Sod, sand, cardboard and newspaper are not permitted.

The New York Grand HOBO Show Conduct Code

Show management reserves the right to disqualify and/or remove any exhibitor who behaves in a manner deemed improper, unethical, dishonest, unsportsmanlike or intemperate, including but not limited to mistreatment of animals, or any comment or remark made in connection with the show considered offensive and/or made with the intent to influence or cast aspersions on the character or integrity of the judging, show management, show volunteers, sponsor or other exhibitors.

Llama Production Classes

All offspring entered in Produce of Dam and Get of Sire must be entered in their respective halter classes. Dams and sires do not need to be present at the show but must be entered, and count as, a llama entry on your entry form. There are no additional fees to enter these classes.

58. **Produce of Dam** – *Entry is made in the dam's name.* 59. Get of Sire – Entry is made in the sire's name.

60. Dam & Daughter – Dam and crias to be shown together under halter. Crias must be 5 months or older per ALSA guidelines. 61. Sire & Son – Sire and son to be shown together under halter. The son must be 5 months of age or older per ALSA guidelines. 62. Bred & Owned Champions – Champion awarded to the top male and top female selected from the top placing bred and owned llamas from each division. Your llama's registration papers will be used as proof of eligibility.

Guidelines for ALSA Approved Classes

Llama Wool Divisions Light Wool: Minimal body wool, short neck wool with smooth legs. Medium Wool: Moderate to long body wool, minimal to moderate neck wool, smooth to moderate leg wool. Heavy Wool: Abundant body and neck wool with minimal to abundant leg wool (ie: leg wool at least to knee and hock). *Show management will combine classes only if there are fewer than 6 entries in a division. *Shorn llamas must be shown in the division in which they would have been shown prior to shearing. *It is recommended that the testicles on a male be visible. If necessary, the fiber on the tail should be trimmed, or the animal should be trained to stand quietly for examination. *Suri llama classes will not be offered due to lack of entries. Suri llamas should be entered in the appropriate wool division.	 Youth Age Divisions Junior: 8 years old through 11 years old. Intermediate: 12 through 14 years old. Senior: 15 through 18 years old. Performance Classes Advanced: Open to entries capable of competing at the advanced level. Animals that have placed 1st, 2nd, or 3rd three or more times in open or novice division of the respective class, or have previously entered the advanced level of that class must compete at the advanced level. Novice: Open to entries who have never entered the advanced division and/or who have earned no more than two 1st, 2nd, or 3rd placements in the open or novice division of that class. Pack: Open to all llamas 5 months or older. Llamas 36 months and older must carry a minimum of 40lbs of weight. **All above rules subject to change depending on revisions to the ALSA
Get of Sire: Three offspring by the same sire and out of at least two different dams. Produce of Dam: Two offspring out of the same dam by the same or different sires. *Entries will be made in the name of the Sire for Get of Sire, and in the name of the Dam for Produce of Dam. *If the exhibitor is not the current owner, a permission to show form must be provided. This can be found on the ALSA website. *All llamas participating in a production class must be shown in respective halter classes. *Production class participants must be listed with the clerk before the class starts.	rulebook.

Guidelines for Non-ALSA Classes

Group Classes

Exhibitor's Herd: Entry consists of three llamas owned, but not necessarily bred, by the exhibitor. One llama must be an intact male, and the other two must be reproductively sound females.

Breeder's Herd: Entry consists of three llamas bred, but not necessarily still owned, by the exhibitor. Entry is made in the name of the breeder. One llama must be an intact male, and the other two must be reproductively sound females.

*Entries to group classes may be made on the day of the show.

*Llamas participating in group classes must be listed with the clerk before the class starts.
